
His wish was truly a wish come true!

On September 11, 2003, the Make-A-Wish Foundation granted Dare's wish, complete with a brand new laptop computer, printer, three animation software packages, and other related accessories. In addition, the Foundation coordinated a day for Dare to visit Cartoon Network and spend some time with the animators there. He toured the station, practiced some animation and spent some time with the top animators in the state.

Caroline Glenn

Caroline was referred to the Make-A-Wish Foundation when she was 17 after she was diagnosed with Ewing Sarcoma. However, it took her two years to decide what she wanted.

Her wish was granted on July 27, 2003. Caroline and her family boarded the Royal Caribbean Nordic Empress ship and set sail on a seven-night cruise to the Bermuda Islands. Caroline visited both the east and west side of Kings Warf Island. She then traveled to Hamilton Island and got to spend two days at sea exploring the top-of-the-line cruise ship.
