# First Steps

Maintaining your plumbing system is the first step to preventing water loss. The plumbing system is a vital part of your home and regular inspection can save water and money.

# Checking for Hidden Plumbing Leaks

Your plumbing system consists of all the pipe and fixtures that are on your property after the water meter connection. Cold, dark, or discolored patches on walls and ceilings can indicate a leaking service line in your home. Bright green patches, sunken and eroded land, or standing water in your yard can mean a service line leak. These leaks are very serious and require immediate reapir to prevent massive water loss and potential property damage. Older homes should schedule annual plumbing inspections by a licensed plumber.

# **Checking Your Meter**

Turn off all the water on your property. Open your meter vault (meter cover) if a small triangle or sweep arm is spinning you have a leak. Read your meter's consumption, record the reading. Wait 10 minutes. Reread your meter, if the number is greater than the first read you have a leak.

## **Toilet Leaks**

Place a few drops of food coloring in the toilet tank. Do not flush the toilet. After fifteen minutes, check the water in the bowl for color. If you see color in the bowl, you have a leak. It is most likely the flapper. Not all flappers fit all toilets. Visit www.toiletflapper.org to find the correct flapper for your toliet.

### **Faucet Leaks**

Turn off faucet completely. Place a measuring cup or glass under the faucet. Check the cup in fifteen minutes, 1 cup = 300 gallons of water a month. It is proabbaly ajust a washer. A new aerator is an inexpensive fix. Check your faucet by placing your finger against water spout. If you feel a screen, you have an aerator. Unscrew the aerator to clean or replace it. Low flow aerators that use less water are available through the water efficiency program.

# How Water Efficient Is Your Home?

To determine how much water each person in your household uses, follow these simple steps.

Using your water bill determine how many gallons of water you used in a month. (8,000).

Divide that number by the "days in period" on your water bill (8,000/30 = 267). That's how much water your family uses per day.

Divide the use per day by the number of people in your home (267/4 = 67).
