waterSmart invites Cobb County 6th, 7th and8th grade students to let their creativity flow in the 9th Annual waterSmart waterArt program. We are looking for young artists to use their talent and create a piece of art that answers the question, "What is the value of water?"

A panel of judges will select 12 winners to appear in the 2019 waterSmart calendar, which will be distributed throughout the region. Additional superlative honors will also be featured.

Entries will be displayed in the gallery at **The Art Station – Big Shanty** from **November 1-15!** Families are invited to visit the gallery Tuesdays – Fridays from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Participating artists will be celebrated at a reception for the students and their families, friends and teachers on

Thursday, November 15 at The Art Station – Big Shanty, where the calendar will also be unveiled.

How to Enter:

- 1. Create a piece of art using any medium you prefer that represents "the value of water."
 - Examples of mediums may include colored pencils, paint, crayons, photo collages, mixed mediums, etc., so get creative!
- 2. Clearly print on the back of the artwork your name, school and grade.
- 3. Work with your teacher to complete the entry form and turn in the needed materials.
- 5. Drop off art work, entry form, description, bio and photo at The Art Station Big Shanty no later than **5 p.m. on Tuesday, October 9**

- One entry per student.
- Students may claim their artwork at The Art Station Big Shanty after the winners' reception on Thursday, November 16; however, Cobb County Water System (CCWS) and its affiliates are not responsible for any artwork that is lost, stolen or damaged. Artwork left unclaimed after Wednesday, November 28, will become property of CCWS.
- The attached entry form must be fully completed by the student with the release signed by a parent or guardian.
- CCWS and its affiliates reserve the right to publish online or in print the student's name, school, grade and or age, as well as images of the artwork and/or student.
